RESNA (The Rehabilitation Engineering and Assistive Technology Society of North America), as an interdisciplinary association of people with a common interest in technology and disability, issues the three credentials for service providers in the field of Assistive Technology:

Assistive Technology Practitioner (ATP) - For service providers who are involved in analysis of a consumer's needs and training in the use of a particular assistive technology device.

Assistive Technology Supplier (ATS) - For service providers who are involved with the sale, including determination of consumer needs and service of rehabilitation equipment, assistive technology and commercially available products and devices.

Rehabilitation Engineering Technologist (RET) - For service providers who apply engineering principles to the design, modification, customization and/or fabrication of assistive technology for persons with disabilities.

Upon successful completion of the required exam, RESNA certification is issued to candidates who may present themselves to the public as service providers. Such individuals are dedicated to working with persons with disabilities whom are interested in exploring assistive technology as an option to achieve their goals.

For claims with dates of service on or after April 1, 2008, the specialty evaluation required for patients receiving a Group 2 single power option or multiple power option PWC, any Group 3 or Group 4 PWC, or a push rim activated power assist device for a manual wheelchair must be performed by a RESNA-certified Assistive Technology Practitioner (ATP) specializing in wheelchairs or a physician who is board-certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. The ATP or physician may not have any financial relationship with the supplier.

In addition, the wheelchair must be provided by a supplier that employs a RESNA-certified Assistive Technology Supplier (ATS) specializing in wheelchairs who is directly involved in the wheelchair selection for the patient.
