There are three employees that are currently quarantining at home. Our most recent test revealed no additional staff members that were positive. All resident tests for the week were negative. MSCC remains on "Outbreak Status" and unfortunately, visitation remains on hold. The Rankin County positivity rate is now at 14.2%. We are now testing staff members twice per week, while residents remain on once per week testing.

Important Notice: The first MSCC vaccine clinic will be held on Wednesday, January 20th. The "second dose" clinic will be held on February 10th with an additional clinic, if needed, to be held on March 3rd. There is still time for both staff and residents that have not signed up to be included. If you want the vaccine, please contact Christy Byrd and let he know. New updates will be posted by 5 p.m. each Friday unless there is an outbreak among residents. MSCC continues to follow all CDC, CMS and State Health Department guidelines and regulations. Our first concern is for the health and safety for all of our residents and staff members.
